When he was 19, Keith had his own show in a gallery in Pittsburgh.

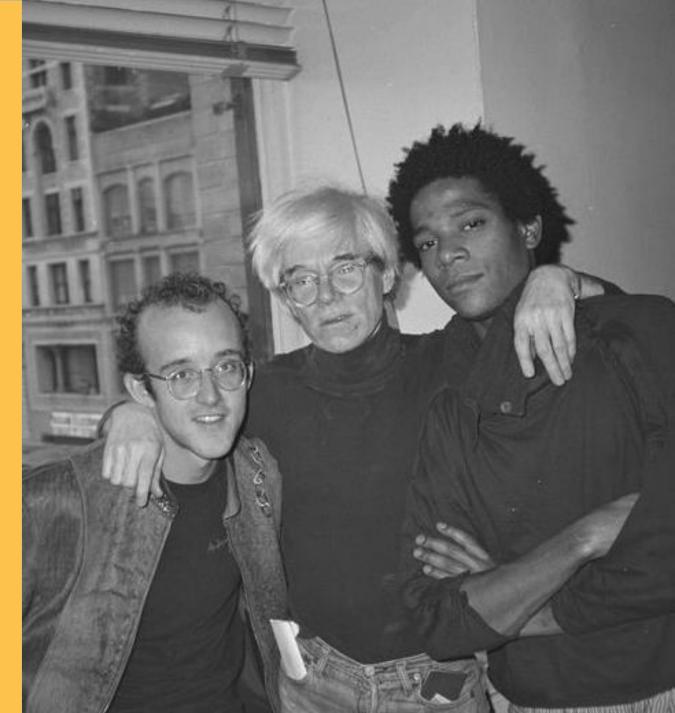
He moved to New York quite soon after that.
