What does LGBT mean?

LGBT stands for lesbian, gay, bi and trans.

Lesbians are women that fall in love with women.
Gay woman means the same as lesbian.

Gay men are men that fall in love with men.

A bi person might fall in love with a man, a woman or a non-binary person.



What does LGBT mean?

Jazz Jennings is a trans woman. When she was born, people thought she was a boy. When Jazz was older, she told people that she's a girl.



Jake Graf is a trans man. When he was born, people thought he was a girl. When Jake was older, he told people that he's a man.



Indya Moore is non-binary. When Indya was born, people thought Indya was a boy. When Indya was older, Indya said "I'm non-binary". Indya is not a woman and is not a man.

Without computers we could not have LGBT pride this year.




Alan Turing

Audrey made an app to help people in Taiwan to stay safe. They can look at the app and find out if there are any face masks for sale in the shop.




Nergis Mavalvala
